6	Capsize Rope  1. Required only for Inflatable Vessels.  2. Approximately 3 x vessel length or 20 m long.	
7	Full set of Sails  1. Including storm sails where appropriate.  2. Required only on sailing vessels.	5-22
8	Proper Patent Anchor, Chain & Rope  1. Vessel ≥ 6 m.; Chain length at least 5 m. long  2. Vessel < 6 m.; Chain length at least 3 m. long  3. Anchor Rope at least 50 m long.

13	Emergency Steering  1. Must be able to operate at all angles.  2. The emergency steering may be portable.	
14	Bilge Pump  1. Compulsory for vessels > 7 m. long;  2. But <b>not</b> applicable to vessels with self-draining decks. (wet-deck)	
15	<ul> <li>Self Bailing Device</li> <li>1. If impracticable for vessels ≤ 7 m. long with no self-draining arrangement; a sufficient bailing device will be used;</li> <li>2. But not applicable to wet-deck vessels.</li> </ul>	
16	Red Flag (500 x 500 mm)  1. To be used when water skiing or with towable inflatable water toys (tubes, water worms, etc.)	
17	Spare Fuel  1. Ensure that the vessel carries sufficient fuel for intended voyage + 25 % Reserve	
18	Outboard Motor Kill-Switch  1. Kill-Switch fitted; including Kill-Switch Lanyard;  2. Test before leaving the shore.	

#### **IMPORTANT NOTES**

- 1. All appliances and equipment (lifejackets, oars, first-aid kit, etc.) belonging to a vessel must be permanently marked with the vessel's name or vessel's number.
- 2. Where any vessel is launched from a trailer, other than a dolly used at a private launching site, the trailer bearing the vessel must be marked in a conspicuous position with the vessel's name or vessel's number (where applicable) and with the owner's name and telephone number.
